Workshop Background:

Equity and justice issues are increasingly recognized as critical dimensions of the marine plastic pollution crisis. However, how to effectively and meaningfully integrate equity principles into our research and practice can be an enormous challenge and has received limited attention. This workshop will facilitate the initial development of concrete steps to promoting equity and justice in marine plastic pollution (MPP) research and practice. In this workshop, we hope to further expand upon our Policy and Action Roadmap and identify effective approaches of incorporating equity-based actions into MPP research and practice. Particular areas of interests include: 1) incorporate equity in funding (research and actions), 2) consider equity in education (science and advocacy), and 3) promote the role of civil society (NGOs and community organizations).
